Becky's peers in recovery rallied around her and offered comfort and support during this difficult time. Fortunately, she did not use any substances in order to escape her emotional pain.

Becky was able to honor her sister by staying in recovery herself and giving Onyx, her sister's cat, a home.

Becky stays connected to the Turning Point, our peer recovery center, her recovery coach, and her peers.

She offers hope to newcomers by sharing her story and giving them rides to meetings, appointments, or job interviews. Better yet, she shares her love of life by taking them on adventures!

More recently, Becky enrolled at the Community College of VT. She has visions of a career in the environmental sciences field.
